Summer Learning and Enrichment for Hoosier Students

Since the summer of 2021, Summer Learning Labs (SLL) has provided high-quality academic and enrichment programming to help thousands of students accelerate their learning. SLL was created by The Mind Trust and United Way of Central Indiana to combat learning loss caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. The program began with 38 sites in Indianapolis and served around 3,000 students.

In 2024. The Mind Trust assumed full program management and partnered with the Indiana Department of Education (IDOE) to replicate the program to more regions across the state through the EWW grant program.

Empowering Local Community Organizations and Schools

In each region, anchor partners serve as the principal program coordinator, recruiting local site partners, managing hiring and training of qualified staff, and ensuring sites follow core program principles. The Mind Trust is the anchor partner for Indianapolis sites. Outside of Indianapolis, the organization provides technical support and guidance on SLL administration to anchor partners who lead the program in their regions.

All Summer Learning Labs follow three core principles:

A focus on acceleration: The English Language Arts (ELA) and math curriculums are aligned to Indiana state standards and designed to give students material that prepares them for the next grade level. Created by Lavinia Group, the curriculum

was developed to accelerate learning in each subject over a five-week time period.

Reaching highest-need students:

SLL removes barriers to impactful. safe, and fun summer programming. The majority of sites are free to attend and many offer breakfast and lunch each day. Maintaining program elements that help working families over summer break is an essential commitment for anchor partners.

Community and school partnerships:

Community partners work alongside districts and schools to offer SLL. Community centers, churches, and youth-serving nonprofits serve as site locations in multiple SLL regions. Schools and districts are not burdened with the task of curriculum development, allowing them to efficiently implement high-quality summer programming. This model allows for greater program reach and uses a collaborative approach to learning to reach as many students as possible.

Building on Proven Partnerships

In 2024, four anchor partner organizations received funding from IDOE's Expanding What Works grant to replicate Indy Summer Learning Labs (ISLL) in their region. Each of these SLL regions outside of Indianapolis were able to serve students for a second year in summer 2025. As academic performance in 2024 and 2025 indicate, results show proof of scalability for the program model, especially when the expertise of locally-based community organizations can be leveraged. Expanding What Works (EWW) SLL regions doubled enrollment from 2024 to 2025 while maintaining double digit ELA and math learning gains.

External Study Shows Program Benefits for Multiple Student Groups

Basis Policy Research (Basis), an independent research organization specializing in data analytics, program evaluation, and applied research, conducted an evaluation of Indy Summer Learning Labs's impact over the 2021, 2022, and 2023 program years.

The study compared ILEARN proficiency rates of students who participated in ISLL with similar students who did not participate. Basis found several statistically significant results:

• The largest statistically significant effects found were for 2023 ISLL

- participants who also received tutoring through Indiana Learns, a statewide math and reading tutoring grant program for eligible students in grades 3-8. Students who participated in both saw statistically significant gains in ELA.
- All students who attended in 2023 outperformed their peers who did not, showing an additional 9 to 17 weeks of instruction.
- The study found statistically significant results in ELA for these four groups who participated in ISLL in 2023:
 - Students who also attended the program in 2021 and 2022
 - Students who attended 70% of the program
 - ▶ Black students
 - Students who qualified for free- and reduced-price meals
- The math results for 2023 ISLL students were generally positive.

Additional external analysis of the program, including measurement of statewide results, will be conducted as more data becomes available.



Curriculum Accelerates **Learning Over Five Weeks**

Summer Learning Labs was created to make as large of an academic impact as possible over a short period of time, making a high-quality curriculum critical to the program. The Lavinia Group created the RISE Summer Learning Program curriculum for Summer Learning Labs. Lessons are designed to accelerate math and reading skills over a five-week period to help students gain ground in core subjects and start the next school year at or above grade level.

KEY ELEMENTS OF THE CURRICULUM INCLUDE:

- 20 days of detailed lesson plans and work problems for grades 1 through 9.
- Focus on phonics instruction based in the science of reading.
- Lessons that strengthen students' critical thinking and ability to analyze complex problems.
- Pre- and post-assessments for each grade level to measure learning in math and ELA.

Every SLL location across the state uses the RISE Summer Learning Program curriculum and administers the program's pre- and postassessments.

Support for Instructional Staff

Instructional staff play a major role in ensuring Summer Learning Labs impacts student learning each year. To ensure staff have what they need to deliver high-quality academic instruction, the program provides a range of supports across each region.



- One week of pre-training on the curriculum for new and returning instructional staff, led by Lavinia Group.
- Weekly professional development with Lavinia Group for implementation guidance.
- Competitive pay for training week and instructional time.
- An organized package of teacher books, student workbooks, and pre- and post-assessments.

The curriculum is designed to accelerate learning and challenges students at all levels to enhance critical thinking skills. Instructional staff across the program reported that over time, students became more willing to attempt difficult problems, actively participate in discussions, and demonstrate an improved use of grade-level learning strategies.

Summer Fun Alongside Learning

Alongside math and ELA instruction, Summer Learning Labs also offer fun enrichment activities like athletics, arts & crafts, music, field trips, STEM activities, and more. Sites are provided funding to support costs for enrichment activities and allow the program to remain free or low-cost.

Each SLL site can select the enrichment activities offered. Anchor partners can help connect sites with youth-serving organizations that can provide enrichment throughout the program. In Indianapolis, ISLL staff creates an enrichment guide with a variety of organizations that site locations can partner with at their discretion.

PERCENTAGE OF FAMILIES surveyed who felt SLL met their expectations for improving their child's math skills.




PERCENTAGE OF 2025 SLL families surveyed who plan to enroll their child in the program next summer.



2025 Program-Wide Enrollment Demographics

Summer Learning Labs served more than 12,000 Hoosier students in summer 2025, the largest program impact year so far. A total of 144 sites across the state served students entering grades 1 through 9 following summer break.




2025 Program **Continues Double-Digit Learning Gains**

All five anchor partners achieved double-digit math and ELA learning gains, showing the scalability of the SLL model.

HOW RESULTS ARE MEASURED:

- All SLL students take a pre- and post-assessment in math and ELA during the first and last weeks of the program.
- A score in the below or approaching range means a student has not passed the assessment.
- Scores within the basic or proficient range indicate that the student passes the assessment and is showing mastery of grade-level math and reading standards.
- Learning gains are measured by the increase in the percentage of students scoring basic or proficient on the post-assessment compared to the pre-assessment.




In 2025, across all five regions, students achieved a 25 percentage point learning gain in ELA and a 24 percentage point learning gain in math.

2025 PROGRAM-WIDE MATH LEARNING GAINS, **ALL STUDENTS**






2025 Program-Wide Learning Gains by Student Group








2025 BGC Summer **Learning Labs Enrollment Demographics**

Expanding What Works SLL regions doubled student enrollment from 2024 to 2025. A major driver of this was an effort by anchor partner Boys & Girls Clubs of the Northern Indiana Corridor (BGCNIC) to work with Boys & Girls Clubs across the state to offer the program.


BGCNIC utilized the facility, staffing, and programmatic resources of fifteen clubs across the state to double their program's enrollment, while maintaining strong academic results. BGC SLL students achieved a 23 percentage point learning gain in ELA and a 22 percentage point learning gain in math.









2025 BGC SLL Learning Gains by Student Group








BGC SLL: Focus on Boys & Girls Clubs of the Northern **Indiana Corridor**


In addition to serving as the anchor partner for 14 other Boys & Girls Clubs of Indiana, BGCNIC operated 15 sites in Logansport, Mishawaka, Monon, Monticello, South Bend, and Walkerton, Indiana. These sites served more than 2,000 students and 65% qualified for free or reduced price meals. This is the second program year for **BGCNIC locations.**

BGCNIC worked with school districts, public charter schools, and a private school to ensure as many students as possible were able to take advantage of high-quality summer programming. Their school partners were: Covenant Christian, Paramount School of Excellence South Bend, Portage School of Leaders, School City of Mishawaka, South Bend Community School Corporation, and Success Academy South Bend.

The SLL model provides a math and ELA curriculum, educator support, and resources to ensure community partners can execute a high-quality summer program. Community partners receive rigorous academic support, and can lean on their strengths of community engagement and programming to operate a well-rounded initiative. Two examples of how this works well are through the regional programs led by Boys & Girls Clubs of the Northern Indiana Corridor and the Boys & Girls Clubs of Fort Wayne. Both Clubs used the SLL model to engage a wide range of partners and serve a large number of students across multiple sites.




BGC SLL: Focus on Boys & Girls Clubs of Fort Wayne

In northeast Indiana, the Boys & Girls Clubs of Fort Wayne worked with anchor partner BGCNIC to operate SLL for the first time in 2025. This hub of 14 sites served around 1,300 students, with 74% of students qualifying for free or reduced-price meals.


The Boys & Girls Clubs of Fort Wayne led the effort to engage a wide variety of community partners to bring SLL to their city. The collective group of partners were: Bridge of Grace Ministries, East Allen County Schools, Euell A. Wilson Center, Fort Wayne Community Schools, Fort Wayne Urban League, MLK Montessori School, and Wellspring Interfaith Social Services.

Indy Summer Learning Labs Celebrates Five Years of Impact

In 2021, Indy Summer Learning Labs (ISLL) began serving students to help address the significant learning loss caused by the COVID-19 pandemic. Since its launch, the program has grown enrollment by more than 75% and continues to show measurable learning gains for all student groups. Of those studetns enrolled in 2025, 69% qualified for free or reduced price meals, 92% identified as students of color, and 17% were English Language Learners.






2025 ISLL Academic Results


For the fifth year in a row, ISLL students achieved double-digit ELA and math learning gains, with percentage point gains increasing from 2024. ISLL is supported by staff at The Mind Trust and academic deans, who help ensure curriculum and programmatic fidelity at each location. In 2025, ISLL was able to offer in-person training for instructional staff, led by the curriculum developer, Lavinia Group.

ISLL students achieved a 27 percentage point learning gain in ELA and a 27 percentage point learning gain in math.






Northwest Summer Learning Labs served students for a second year, growing enrollment from 700 students to more than 740 in 2025. Northwest SLL partnered with schools, community centers, and churches to offer the program in East Chicago, Gary, Hammond, and Merrillville, Indiana. Most of the program's participants were students of color and qualified for free or reduced price meals.




Northwest SLL: A Second Year of **Learning Gains**

For a second year, Northwest SLL students achieved double-digit learning gains in math and reading. All Northwest SLL sites were free to attend, creating access to high-quality summer academic programming for hundreds of students across northwest Indiana.

Northwest SLL students achieved a 23 percentage point learning gain in ELA and a 14 percentage point learning gain in math.



2025 NORTHWEST SLL ELA LEARNING GAINS, ALL STUDENTS




2025 NORTHWEST SLL MATH LEARNING **GAINS, ALL STUDENTS**






2025 Northwest SLL Learning Gains by Student Group
















2025 Southeast Summer Learning Labs Enrollment Demographics


A Second **Year of Strong Academic Gains**

For a second year, Southeast Summer Learning Labs achieved strong math and ELA learning gains. Feedback from families and site leaders emphasized the quality and dedication of Southeast SLL's instructional staff. The program was also able to offer transportation for some students, which helps more students access the program and positively impacts attendance rates.



2025 SOUTHEAST SLL ELA LEARNING **GAINS, ALL STUDENTS**




2025 SOUTHEAST SLL MATH LEARNING GAINS, ALL STUDENTS






2025 Wabash Summer Learning Labs Enrollment Demographics

Wabash SLL served families in northeast Indiana, at schools located in North Manchester and Wabash, Indiana. The program was offered at no charge, creating an accessible summer program option for families in the area. With 97% of families surveyed sharing that they would enroll their student in the program again next year, Wabash SLL continues to provide a popular and productive summer option for families


A Second Year of Double-Digit **Learning Gains**

For a second year, Wabash SLL achieved doubledigit learning gains in math and ELA. Families could see the difference in their child after program participation. 97% of families surveyed felt the program met or exceeded their expectations in terms of helping their child with math and reading skills. Wabash SLL was able to offer transportation, a service that families and site leaders felt was a value-add to the program's effectiveness. Families also shared high levels of satisfaction with instructional staff at Wabash SLL sites.




