# **Position Overview**

The Senior Director of Policy & Strategic Partnerships plays a crucial role in shaping, developing, and executing The Mind Trust's policy and legislative strategies at the State and local levels. The Senior Director will lead TMT's policy research, analysis, and development process in alignment with TMT's goals and objectives. The Senior Director will also lead TMT's efforts to advocate (within our parameters as a 501c3) for policies that promote the growth and sustainability of high-quality autonomous schools, remove race and income of predictors of life outcomes, and expand TMT's impact beyond Indianapolis. The role requires a deep understanding of legislative and regulatory landscapes, as well as the ability to navigate complex issues. The ideal candidate is an experienced leader with a track record of building strong relationships with policymakers and education stakeholders, as well as a proven ability to synthesize complicated material in order to present it in a user-friendly way. The candidate demonstrates sound judgment, exercises strong attention to detail, has excellent organizational and project management skills, and sets a high bar for quality.

#### **Position Responsibilities**

- Research and Policy
  - Develop annual policy and research agenda including studying trends and gaps in education policy nationwide
  - Plan and oversee execution of research and design of white papers and other reports
  - Identify policies necessary to maintain a landscape conducive to autonomous school growth and a portfolio school model, ensuring that Indiana remains one of the strongest policy environments in the country
  - Identify and recommend potential programmatic solutions to ensure equitable implementation of a system of high-quality autonomous schools (e.g., special education or transportation solutions)
  - Review state and local policies, evaluate their effectiveness, and make recommendations for improvements
  - Participate in generating tangible policy solutions to remove barriers to high-quality autonomous schools growth or implementation
  - Make recommendations to the Leadership Team regarding policy opportunities to pursue locally and beyond.
  - Stay informed regarding legislative and regulatory efforts and changes, assessing their potential impact on TMT
  - Stay up-to-date on the most critical national education issues by monitoring national news, researching leading organizations, keeping abreast of the most cutting-edge school designs, and understanding federal education policy changes
  - Regularly brief the Policy & Strategic Partnerships team and broader TMT staff
    when appropriate on national trends in education

- Assist with researching and evaluating policy landscapes in potential new geographies
- Support CEO & leadership team members by providing guidance on policy implications, potential risks, briefs and background research where necessary
- Advocacy
  - Read and analyze legislation and local policies, identifying issues that TMT should track and influence
  - Pass at least one piece of key legislation each year
  - Build and maintain relationships with government officials, regulatory agencies, and relevant stakeholders.
  - Advocate for the organization's interests and influence policy decisions through effective communication and collaboration
  - Work with the communications team to develop and implement strategies to communicate policy ideas and TMT's policy positions to broader audiences
  - Build and participate in coalitions to support strong K-12 policy
