### Dear Friends,

Eleven years ago, we launched The Mind Trust and set out with a simple guiding principal: talented educators with big ideas—if given time and the right supports—can unleash the revolution needed to give every student access to a high-quality education. Over the past two years, The Mind Trust and its partners have accelerated the pace of progress toward realizing this ambitious goal.

In unprecedented partnership with Indianapolis Public Schools (IPS) and the Indianapolis Mayor's Office, we've catalyzed a promising start for Innovation Network Schools. Since 2015, we've launched or supported the conversion of ten Innovation Network Schools and witnessed encouraging enrollment and early ISTEP+ results in the schools that operated in 2016-2017. With nine more schools under development through our school incubators, Indianapolis is well-positioned to ensure that this promising start continues.

We've launched a school support strategy that is providing school leaders with premier professional development, as well as a talent innovation fund designed to spur innovative approaches to finding and retaining top education talent.

We've continued to build the conditions that give public schools in Indianapolis the greatest opportunity for success. We've worked to increase the resources available to Indianapolis' high-quality charter school sector and led robust community engagement efforts to develop new advocates for education innovation. Enroll Indy—a nonprofit launched through our Education Entrepreneur Fellowship—recently launched its OneMatch unified enrollment system for students in 101 district and charter schools across Indianapolis.

To make this progress possible, individuals, foundations, and companies have contributed over \$24 million to our work since 2015. We are humbled by this generosity, both because of the impact it has every day on Indianapolis students and because it affirms what we have come to believe over the past eleven years:



# From **Opportunity** to Impact

Since our founding in 2006, we—along with a host of partners and other civic leaders—have helped create an ecosystem that gives talented education leaders the opportunity to innovate and thrive in Indianapolis. As a result, Indianapolis is now among the nation's very best places to launch and grow high-quality schools and education nonprofits.

To take advantage of this once-in-a-generation opportunity to transform public education, in 2016, The Mind Trust launched a comprehensive plan focused on three key strategies:

- Growing Great Schools
- Investing in World-Class Talent
- Amplifying the Conditions for Success through Policy and Community Engagement

These strategies are yielding significant results.

# **10 SCHOOLS**

We've helped incubate or convert 10 new charter schools and Innovation Network Schools since 2015.

# **5,768 STUDENTS**

These 10 schools, along with the 6 schools The Mind Trust helped launch before 2015, currently serve 5,768 students.

# \$24 MILLION

Since 2015, we've raised \$24 million in local and national contributions to help realize Indianapolis' opportunity to transform public education.



Public school students in IPS boundaries, IDOE data, November 2017



### A Promising Start for Innovation Network Schools

Since 2014, The Mind Trust has worked with Mayor Greg Ballard, Mayor Joe Hogsett, and IPS Superintendent Dr. Lewis D. Ferebee to catalyze a promising start for Innovation Network Schools in Indianapolis.

14 SCHOOLS	We've helped launch or convert 10 and supported another 4 Innovation Network Schools in IPS.

### **GROWING GREAT SCHOOLS**



**MARIAMA CARSON,** 2014-2016 Fellow at The Mind Trust and Innovation Network School Leader

An award-winning principal with over 20 years of experience, Mariama Carson received a fellowship from The Mind Trust in 2014 to develop a Spanish language immersion school. In 2016, she restarted a chronically underperforming school as a dual-language Innovation Network School and charter school called Global Preparatory Academy at Riverside 44. In her first year, Mariama doubled the number of students passing both Math and English ISTEP+ exams at the school, taking the school from an "F" to an "A" on the state's growth-only letter grade system for new schools.

The Mind Trust launches high-quality schools in Indianapolis that expand opportunities for students across the city. Through our fellowships and robust continuum of ongoing school supports, we give talented school leaders the time and supports necessary to launch and lead great schools.

Seven schools have been launched through The Mind Trust's Charter and Innovation School Fellowships since 2015.

# Great Schools Never Stop Improving.

### INVESTING IN WORLD-CLASS TALENT

Great schools require high-quality pipelines for recruiting and developing talented teachers and school leaders. To this end, The Mind Trust has supported an array of initiatives designed to help schools recruit, prepare, develop, and retain a workforce of talented and diverse teachers.

### The Principal Pipeline

### **New Approaches to Teacher Talent**

In 2017, The Mind Trust created its Talent Innovation Fund to encourage local schools to develop innovative approaches for attracting and retaining high-quality teachers and school leaders. This year, The Mind Trust invested in new initatives at IPS, Christel House Academy, and KIPP: Indy.

### Rethinking Teacher Recruitment & Training in IPS

 This investment has allowed IPS to partner with the National Council on Teacher Quality to overhaul its student teaching program, which will prepare 150 student teachers each year to take full-time positions at IPS schools. It has also laid the groundwork for the development of a Special Education Residency Program and an Aspiring Teacher Residency Program.

### Christel House Academy: IndyTeach Teacher Residency Program

 The IndyTeach Teacher Residency Program is an in-house teacher residency program designed to recruit, prepare, support, and retain exceptional K-12 teachers. The Mind Trust's investment has helped IndyTeach secure accreditation to license teachers of secondary grades and launch a pilot program with four teacher apprentices in the 2017-2018 school year.

### The Emerging Leaders Program at KIPP: Indy

 The Emerging Leaders Program provides select KIPP teachers with yearlong leadership development designed to support teacher retention and develop a pipeline of school leaders. Four teachers completed the program in 2016-2017 and another four teachers are currently participating in the program for the 2017-2018 school year.



# AMPLIFYING THE CONDITIONS FOR SCHOOL SUCCESS

Indianapolis' opportunity to transform education exists because our city now has a unique combination of ideal conditions for growing high-quality schools.

### **Strengthening our High-Quality Charter Sector**

**#1 RANKED** 

Indiana has the #1 ranked charter school law in the United States.

**#2 HEALTHIEST** 

Indiana's charter school sector is rated the 2nd healthiest in the country.

\$60 MILLION

With assistance from The Mind Trust, The IDOE received a \$60 million grant to support new charter schools.

Since 2001, the leadership of three mayors and numerous school and civic leaders has developed Indianapolis' charter school sector into one of the strongest in the country. The National Alliance for Public Charter Schools (NAPCS) has named Indiana's charter school law the strongest in the nation and its charter school environment the second healthiest. Through our community engagement, school incubation fellowships, and policy expertise, The Mind Trust helps talented school leaders expand the superior impact of charter schools in Indianapolis.

In 2017, The Mind Trust provided critical assistance in crafting the IDOE's proposal for the United States Department of Education's Expanding Opportunity Through Quality Charter Schools Program (CSP) grant. The proposal resulted in a grant of close to \$60 million to support a minimum of 50 new charter schools.

### **Uniting Schools with One Application**

# **101 SCHOOLS**

101 public charter and district schools are participating in Enroll Indy's One-Match enrollment system.

In November 2017, Enroll Indy launched OneMatch, a unified enrollment system for charter schools and IPS. OneMatch is the culmination of the Education Entrepreneur Fellowship The Mind Trust awarded in 2015 to Caitlin Hannon, who sought to develop a



system that would improve families' access to the many different school choice options in Indianapolis and support better planning and data analysis by school operators and policymakers.

# **Empowering Schools through Indiana's Innovative Policy Framework**

Originally passed in 2014 and expanded in 2015, Indiana's Innovation Network School legislation empowers school districts to voluntarily transform schools into autonomous Innovation Network Schools. In contrast to similar laws in other cities, Indiana's law gives schools full operational autonomy and provides pathways for both traditional and charter schools of various levels of quality to pursue Innovation Network School status. The Mind Trust's Innovation School Fellowship and Education Empowerment Awards give talented school leaders the time and supports necessary to launch great schools through this nationally-unique law.

### **Engaging Civic Leaders**

# **15 CIVIC LEADERS**

15 civic leaders have supported education innovation as members of the Lewis-Hubbard Group.

Since the Lewis-Hubbard Group's formation in 2014, this group of 15 Indianapolis civic leaders has achieved significant influence on education policy. Led by Indianapolis City-County Council President Maggie Lewis and

businessman and former Economic Advisor in President George W. Bush's administration Al Hubbard, the group has raised public awareness about and advocated for innovative uses for underutilized school facilities, as well as the strong potential and early success of Innovation Network Schools.

### **Elevating Parent Voice**

**8 SCHOOLS** We've supported 8 schools with Parent Organizing Awards.

Since 2016, The Mind Trust has supported the community engagement efforts of new high-quality schools through its Parent Organizing Awards, which support school-based parent and family engagement. Parent organizers like Azia Watts help lay the ground work for strong partnerships between community members and new school operators and elevate the voices of parents and families.




